

2024 Forecast

>Challenge 1: One ongoing semi-mystery - Scavenger Hunt; (due at final meeting of 2024)

For example, if the listed item was "house", you could use any block pattern with a house, fabric with tossed houses, a house shaped button, etc. The more the merrier. >Challenge 2: Pin-Up Challenge (due at April 2024 meeting) - Display for Quilty Pins: sash, hat, wall hanging, etc.

Make something to display all of the quilt pins you have collected over the years.

Can be anything that will display pins; preferably a quilted object.

>Challenge 3 - Quilt Panel (due at August 2024 meeting) - make a quilted object from a quilt panel. This could be a charity quilt, a stuffed animal panel, or even an apron panel. Grab a panel from your stash and get creative!


