

Furoshiki. Sashiko. Kanzashi. Zakka. Fabrigami.

These are all examples of Japanese Fabric Arts that are popular today. Maybe you've heard of them and wanted to learn more. Maybe you've used some of them in your projects but didn't realize the Japanese connection.

At our April meeting, we'll learn about some of these techniques through hands-on experiences. You'll get to try them out in rotating breakout sessions, so you can include some of them in your future sewing projects.



The Japanese culture encourages frugality, simplicity, and green living. Since April is Earth Month, some of the techniques we learn will crossover into "living a life that honors our earth."

Block of the Month - 25 patch

This month's BOM is a 25 patch block made using $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. This is a good use of scraps. The blocks are due at the May meeting. Unfinished blocks will be $10\frac{1}{2}$ ", finished 10". Block kits include a selection of $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares, and a $10\frac{1}{2}$ " piece of the focus fabric so you can see what colors are needed for the block.

April 25 is World Penguin Day!
