Workshop Committee Report

The Workshop Committee Chair has been hard at work trying to come up with some fabulous workshops for the Westerville Quilt Guild members - and now there are actually three possibilities. The first will be in the beginning of 2008, the second closer to the summer, and the third is going to be for 2009 if we still want that one.

For the first workshop we'll take over one of the meetings early in 2008 and Gail Wadley will present her "Memory Quilt" class in a "lecture/demo" instead of a hands-on format. We decided to do it this way because after taking the class at NQA this summer and even meeting with her at OSU to get a "head start" on the photos because there were too many people in the class - it still was too much to do in one workshop. So she'll give us all the details about preparing our photos on the computer, some software tips, and things like that; then she'll show us how to print them out using the great new Electric Quilt fabric that is available (we'll have some for you to purchase at the meeting). Then you can take home some of the fabric and do it yourself at home - OR those that are interested can sign up and we'll have Gail come back on a Saturday and show us her patterns/layouts for the "Memory Quilts" from the class at NQA and we can complete the projects in a workshop. The most important thing will be to already have your photos printed and processed before coming to the completion workshop. And - if you don't have a computer you can "buddy up" with someone that does if you want to make one of the quilts - most of the stores that develop photos will put them onto a CD for you and you'll


