Quilter's Green Tips: Green as in Reuse/Green as in Plants

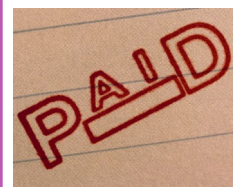
Instead of throwing away the selvage edges that we trim off of our fabrics, save them for the yard. That portion of fabric is a tighter weave. So, it is stronger to tie up tomatoes, peppers, perennials, etc. And, you can cut them whatever length you need.

Just think how you will personalize your yard from your own stash.

So, the big question is: Do you have more plants or more fabric? Either one will be pretty and good for you and the environment.

Note: I got this tip from Mary Zesinger (former CMQ member) in a class she taught years ago. Thanks Mary!
