

You're Invited! We will be making self binding blankets for the Fourth Trimester Project.

The following stations will be set up:

Pressing - press fabric for initial cutting and again before final stitching/edging. Supplies Needed: two ironing boards and irons

Cutting – cut 30" and 40" squares; cut miters. Supplies Needed: large cutting boards (2), rotary cutters (2)

Pinning/Turning - pin squares for sewing; birth quilt after mitering

Sewing – sew 4 30" seams; sew miters. Supplies Needed: up to 10 sewing machines, basic sewing supplies, neutral thread, sewing machine needles.

Other Supplies Needed: fabric - complimentary squares 1@ 30" and 1@40"

If you know what station you would like to work at, please bring the tools noted in the description above.

The preferred fabric is flannel but anything washable is usable. I have seen patterns for minky, cottons, fleece, etc.

While most instructions call for single cuts of fabric, I don't see why you couldn't piece the 30" square. So dig through your stash and see what you have that might work.

The basic patterns call for two yards of two different (but coordinating) fabrics. Cutting a 30" and 40" square from each fabric will result in two 35" baby blankets.
