SOCIAL TIME - Meet and Greet - Arrive Early When You Can...



The Westerville Quilt Guild has been gifted with fabric and project materials. We have kits for quilts, burp cloths, no-bind blankets as well as fabric yardage for totes or other projects. Kits will be available at the meeting.

We will bring the Burp Cloth Accuquilt die for anyone who would like to cut out burp cloths. The burp cloth die cuts an 8.5" x 18.5" shape . A generous fat quarter can yield (two pieces) one burp cloth. (NOTE: The 10" strip leftover from trimming the 30" square on the no-bind blankets is big enough for one shape.)

2025 Mystery Quilt — due Aug 26

This is an 8-part mystery quilt.
The fabric requirements were given out at the February meeting. Since are behind, the parts will be doubled up, so that there will be a 2-part clue at each meeting.
